Heather, our guest speaker preceding the AGM, is also the Casey Cardinia Local History Librarian. Heather was able to show us a few of the resources on offer at the Casey Cardinia Library Corporation. The resources available include magazines, books, free access to the internet, assorted CD ROMs as well as access to the Local History Archive. The Local History Archive contains files on families, community buildings, historic

homes and photos. Not all the branches of CCLC have the same access or resources so you would need to check with your branch to see what is available. Heather was able to leave us with handouts from the CCLC and a listing of favourite sites on the internet. For those of you who were not able to attend the AGM, these handouts are available at the Narre Warren Library.

Before breaking for afternoon tea we thanked Eileen Durdin for her dedication and long service with the Narre Warren & District Family History Group by awarding her an Honorary Life Membership. Eileen has been a member of the Group since November 2002. After a couple of months Eileen became a volunteer in the Research Room and within the first year joined the committee as the Minute Secretary. The Casey Cardinia Combined Index is a database developed by Eileen that now holds 92 books fully indexed with just under 80000 entries. This database is a crucial component of our local family history work.

In addition to all this work Eileen still volunteers in the Research Room and now co-ordinates our Away Days. Eileen will put her hand up for sausage sizzles, heritage days, Expos, cemetery tours the list goes on and on. Eileen has always shown such dedication to the Group. Lorraine Taylor presented Eileen with her Honorary Life Membership badge, Jenny Hayes presented flowers, Fay McCoubrie presented a copy of the citation and Rex McFarlane presented Eileen with her certificate. Well deserved, congratulations Eileen.

We were very excited to have Casey Cardinia Remembers added to the nation's digital treasures at PANDORA. It was a tremendous pat on the back for all involved in Casey Cardinia Remembers, we thought we had something special and hoped we were doing it right, but we weren't entirely sure but, it turns out that we do and we are.

For over 50 years Max has built and maintained this collection of photos of Narre Warren, Narre Warren North and Harkaway. Naturally, relinquishing the collection involved considerable thought about its future, I was very proud that the family history group was considered worthy of such an honour.

What a marvellous job Jenny Hayes and Wendy Eldridge did with the Expo last September. Not only was it was a very exciting day that resulted in a very tidy sum of money, it was an extremely successful public relations exercise for the Group as well. Hot on their heels was Wendy Brock with another fabulous Seniors Week in October and in April Jenny, Wendy B and Shirley led the way at Bunnings with another fabulous sausage sizzle. Again this year, we've participated in various state and national events like National Family History Week with an Open Day in August, History Week with a great tour of Cranbourne Cemetery in October and Heritage Week with the City of Casey and National Trust in April. None of these events just blossom without hard work from those at the helm and support from members on the day, but we're lucky to have been privileged with both, so blossom they did.

Members have enjoyed a variety of Away Days with Jenny and Eileen. They've visited the State Library, Public Record Office Victoria, Salvation Army Archives, Bendigo Family History Expo, Boroondara Cemetery and the Leongatha Family History Seminar. I've been on a couple of Away Days myself and I know how much fun they can be. But, they also play an important part in ensuring the long term viability of the family history group – you just can't get that sort of interaction and camaraderie on the Internet, it's a special thing that happens when you get a good mix of people together and many Away Days are just full of this. So Congratulations and Thank You to Jenny and Eileen for making these days possible for us.

It was very gratifying to see so many invitations going out to this year's Volunteers' Morning Tea, almost half our members received an invitation by volunteering in the Research Room, or at the Expo, stock take, cemetery tour, doing cemetery tour research, manning display tables, indexing Casey Cardinia books, surveying monuments and memorials, the committee and VIPs. This is something we should all be very proud of; it says a lot about us, all of it good!

One of our constant challenges is to not expect too much from ourselves or others. It's easy to forget that whenever something is done for, or the family history group is advanced in some way, one or many have given their time, possibly at some financial cost to themselves to get it done. Yes, the committee and VIPs take on roles knowing there is work involved but where is the line in the sand? Sometimes we have to look hard for it, we know it's somewhere in between idealism and what we'd like to do and achieve and the reality or what we can do and achieve. No one likes to compromise – but at the end of the day, there has to be enough time for committee members to do their own family history or they just won't stay on the committee for long.

I would like to thank the 2012-13 committee, including both Wendies G and E, on behalf of the Group for their dedication and hard work this year. There's no doubt the committee have been put to the test as we've lifted the lid on the too hard basket and begun poking around inside. The new Associations Incorporation Act 2012 brought us a new set of model rules and reporting procedures. We've met that challenge head on and devised our own Constitution. This one job alone has involved at least 100 man hours in attending workshops, evaluating the new model rules, compiling a draft constitution, reviewing the draft and making it ready to be presented to members. These hours were put in above and beyond the committee's 'normal' jobs.

We must acknowledge the invaluable support given to us by the Casey Cardinia Library Corporation, especially with getting the Internet installed in the Research Room. I hope members will take the opportunity to use it and learn from each other.

Our thoughts are starting to turn to our 25th Anniversary next May. We've come a long way since that first meeting of a handful of people with an interest in family history. We watched as the Internet and big business turned the family history world upside down and we listened while we were told that the Internet would mean the demise of groups like ours. I think we're in a strong position to face the next set of challenges. We know there's more to a successful group than just a room with resources; we know it's a mix of resources and people - people who are willing to help, willing to share and willing to give things a go. I think we have that mix, I think we've always had it and it has served us well. It's evidenced by the wonderful resources that we've accumulated, mostly through sheer hard work, the laughter of a car full of members on their way to PROV and our reputation in the wider family and local history world. We have much to be thankful for, but we've worked hard to get it and will continue to work hard to keep it with your help.



In many cases detailed biographies have been written by descendants or compiled by the family history group, giving an insight into the early days of many Casey Cardinia families and individuals.



An Unusual Type of Reunion—Part three

In Parts one and two, I spoke about the 160th reunion of descendants of those who arrived in Point Henry, Geelong aboard the Dutch barque-Zes Gezusters-Six Sisters in January 1853.

Prior to the reunion, in fact many months prior, those interested were invited to send details of their family who travelled on this ship. Specific sheets with columns, to be completed with details were emailed to us all, and these were then emailed back to Liz Seaton, the researcher and descendant of one of the 69 families represented at the reunion.

Liz and her helpers, and Rob Newland, organiser of the event spent many many hours putting together a DVD of information. This arrived not long ago, and was evident of the impeccable research which had been completed by all involved.

Rob completed a very thorough research booklet of 50 pages in which he mentioned the research he had completed. Other items were the passenger lists, a poem titled 'The Voyage Out', excerpts from two issues of the London times in 1852 and newspaper items of interest.

Dossiers of each family were included in the DVD, as well as photographs from the reunion, there were details of marriages of some of the emigrants who married another emigrant from the voyage. At the reunion the dossiers were available to peruse but time was very limited for a full look.

Comments from the organisers, is that the research will continue and we are invited to send additional info for updates that will be emailed to all involved. The DVD was a great way to organise and distribute all of this information, far far cheaper than printing hard copies.

In the next few weeks I will be searching the dossiers for any connections to my families of interest, and also finding those who may have settled in the Casey-Cardinia region.
